When 50 inches isn't enough, developing a water conservation implementation plan in Georgia

Abstract:

Average annual rainfall in Georgia is 50 inches yet the state is faced with serious water management issues. In 2007, the State initiated a water planning process. The plan addresses water quantity and quality issues as well as dealing with interbasin transfers, consumptive use, and establishment of planning districts. The plan also called for the development of water conservation implementation plans. This presentation will provide an overview of the State plan and discuss the specifics of the water conservation plan for the agricultural sector.
