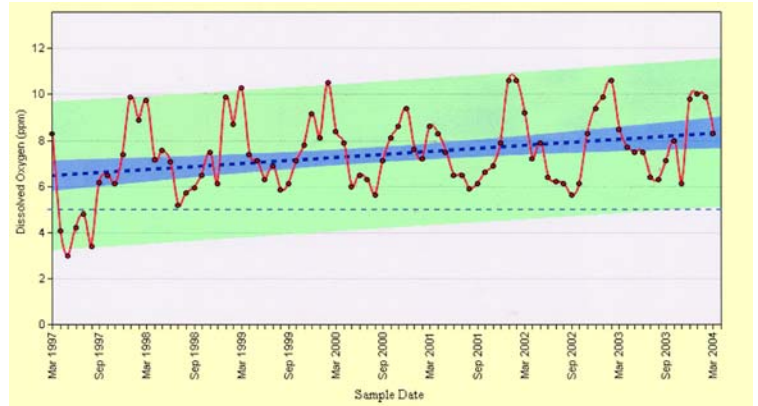
Accomplishments 1992-2003

- 💧 EPA-approved chemical and bacteriological Quality Assurance protocols
- 💧 200 Citizen Groups and 4,000 Certified Monitors
- 💧 1,600 Sampling Sites on 580 Waterbodies
- 💧 150,000 Measurements
- 💧 35 Active Citizen Trainers



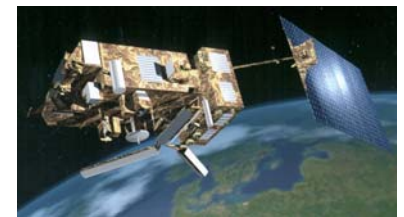
Relational Database and Website

- 💧 On-line data entry and access capabilities allow monitors to submit data from home and generate scores of customized graphs.



Specialty Studies

- 💧 AWW groups have partnered with researchers to use remote sensing, standard methods and AWW protocols to monitor nutrients in water.
- 💧 Groups work with government and business to develop Watershed Management Plans.



- 💧 *Citizen Guides to Alabama Rivers* enhance public awareness of the historical and ecological features of watersheds.
- 💧 *Waterbody Reports* feature citizen data and key watershed issues of groups.

Global Water Watch



- 💧 The AWW program has served as a model for community-based water monitoring projects in the Philippines, Brazil, Ecuador and Thailand.
- 💧 Groups network via training workshops, study tours and a GWW website.



AWW Association

- 💧 Several groups have affiliated to form a non-profit 501.c.3 organization that supports the AWW program and advocates better water quality and policy.
